First Time at the Pantry

I am part of a service learning course at the University of Illinois this semester. Service learning courses require students to work at a local charity organization as a form of field observation, as opposed to studying pieces of literature. A friend of mine had worked in soup kitchen in the past and enjoyed it, so I decided I would work at the Wesley Food



Pantry. By the time volunteer hours began, it was only a few days before what would be my first shift on the food distribution day. I signed up for orientation that Wednesday night, and would return to Wesley the following night to volunteer.

I was both anxious and excited on the morning of my first day volunteering at the Food Pantry. Orientation the night before had given me a clear understanding of how the Pantry worked, and what my job as a volunteer would consist of. However, it is something that you can't quite grasp until you see it for yourself. Seemingly hundreds of people waiting their turn to pick out groceries, hallways filled with stacks of donated food- it was very overwhelming. Despite the complexities of the event, it ran very smoothly. During my shift, all I saw were happy faces. I was worried that I would be asked questions I wouldn't be able to answer. To my relief I found that the clients were familiar with the process, and those who weren't were often accompanied by friends and family members who showed them how it all worked. Clients flowed through, picking exactly what food they wanted, and left grateful and confident that their family would make it through the end of the month with plenty of food to eat. The client's ability to pick out what food they wanted stood out to me as a great addition to

the traditional food pantry, and one that I had never heard of. One woman I helped shop for groceries told me that her kids loved fruit, so her bags were packed with assorted canned fruits. Despite the hardships in her life, she could at least be happy providing her children with food they would enjoy.

Wesley provides much more than meals for these families, it provides the opportunity for families to eat what they like. This opportunity is hard to come by for struggling families, and Wesley makes these families lives every bit better that they can. By the time my shift was over, I felt very confident about my work for the day. My time at the Pantry was well spent, and I got to make a real difference to the locals of Champaign county. I now look forward to every third Thursday of the month as a day that I can escape the stress of class and do some good for the community.
