

Pantry Partners with Local Social Service Providers

So far this year we have hosted many amazing social service groups:



During the last 2 Wesley Evening Food Pantry Distributions, Illini Medical Screening Society, a nursing group from the university, has served over 50 pantry clients by perform-

ing routine blood testing, vitals and patient consults. During the last distribution a client in a medical crisis was sent from the pantry to the hospital for care. We are so grateful that IMSS was on-site to provide this critical evaluation and referral service.

Champaign County Health Care Consumers have advocated for our client's access to health care by discussing Medicaid with the clients and answering their health care related questions.



Campaña De Salud was on site adver-

tising for their upcoming free health fair on April 9th. The fair includes medical screenings, health education, free food and much more.

Shining a Spotlight on Our Volunteers



Do you know Clyde Snyder? If you've spent any time at the Evening Food Pantry, we're willing to bet you recognize his face (or at the very least his signature neon orange suspenders!).

Clyde Snyder is a retired United Methodist pastor who also preaches at Allerton on Sunday mornings. Besides

that, we also know him as one of two Setup Coordinators, chairperson of the food pantry's executive board, one of two main Cleanup Coordinators, and the general Go-to Guy on pantry night. Natalie got involved with the Graduate Employees Organization (GEO), and it is through the GEO that Natalie started volunteering with the food pantry in January of 2010. She says that now she can see how the GEO's ideals are closely aligned with one of the pantry's fundamental principles: to provide



emergency food items to families during the evening hours so that clients do not feel the pressure of having to leave work early or take a lengthy lunch break in order to get the food that they need.
